

Quality plum for the north


Are you looking for a fancy plum that is easy to grow? 'Black Ice' may be for you!

It's a large plum hardy for North Dakota (at least to Zone 3b) with sweet, juicy, flesh. The quality of the fruit is reported to be comparable to plums produced in California, Chile, and other major plum production areas.

'Black Ice' fruits ripen in early August, about 2 to 4 weeks earlier than most other American plums. The trees are naturally dwarf (about 10 feet tall), making them easy to care for.

Created from a cross between a cherry plum and a Japanese dessert plum, 'Black Ice' needs a pollinator for good fruit set.

'Toka' is often used as a pollinator plum.

'Black Ice' is available from Jung Seed Company and several nurseries in North Dakota, along with other sources. 

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
